D	An irregular area of highway to the east of Oswin Street immediately adjacent to the London College of Communication, and which measures 23.58 metres in length (at its longest point) and 5.27 metres in width (at its widest point);
Е	An irregular shaped area of highway to the north of Brook Drive immediately adjacent to the London College of Communication, and which measures 5.56 metres in length (at its longest point) and 36.08 metres in width (at its widest point); and
F	An irregular shaped area of highway to the west of Pastor Street immediately adjacent to the London College of Communication, and which measures 13.73 metres in length (at its longest point) and 17.15 metres in width (at its widest point).

IF THE ORDER IS MADE the stopping up will be authorised to enable the development described in the Schedule to this Notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted under Part III of the Act by the Council on 10 January 2019 under local planning authority reference number 16/AP/4458.
