Cooks Road permanent road closure



*The London Borough of Southwark (Charged-for parking places) (Cooks Road) Order 202**
*The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Cooks Road) Traffic Order 202**
*The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (Cooks Road) Order 202**

The purpose of these Orders are to implement a part road closure, and changes to parking within existing Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) 'J' and to waiting restrictions as permanent, following review outcomes of experimental measures introduced in the Cooks Road area (Newington ward), in the London Borough of Southwark.

Proposals include:-

'at any time' motor vehicle restriction in Cooks Road between its junction with Fleming Road/Otto Street and a point 27 metres south-east of that junction which would include exemptions for emergency services vehicles and for vehicles used for road maintenance, refuse collection or cleansing purposes; exceptions are provided for postal service, taxis and (on a discretionary basis) disabled persons vehicles (registered to Southwark resident 'blue badge' holders), rapid response healthcare workers vehicles and SEND vehicles.

to remove existing parking in CPZ 'J' in Cooks Road south-west side (south-east of its junction with Otto Street) 23 metres permit holders parking removed.

to amend waiting restrictions in Cooks Road, Fleming Road and Otto Street to accommodate the parking change and closure.

These Orders supersede similar provisions at the above location implemented by way of experimental Orders made under section 9 of the 1984 Act (which would be revoked). The trial measures were part of the London Streetspace Programme – Walworth trials (public notice originally advertised in *the London Gazette* on 20 August 2020¹), additions and modifications to the scheme were advertised in *the London Gazette* on 24 September 2020² and 8 July 2021³, of which the overall objectives are to reduce traffic, encourage active travel and support local businesses. The trial road closure at Cooks Road will be revoked in full as this is being proposed as new permanent changes to the Highway. Please note, all other parts of the LSP Walworth trials have previously been revoked and made as new permanent schemes in March 2022.

As part of the Walworth Streetspace review an extensive public consultation was carried out for a period of 9 weeks. A good response rate was received, area-wide, and provided a good understanding of local opinion regarding the measures. The feedback received from the consultation has informed the proposals in addition to monitoring results and an equality impact assessment.

Cooks Road permanent road closure

*The London Borough of Southwark (Charged-for parking places) (Cooks Road) Order 202**

*The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Cooks Road) Traffic Order 202**

*The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (Cooks Road) Order 202**

1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended ('the 1984 Act').
2. The effect of the Orders would be, on a permanent basis: -
 - (a) to provide a 'no motor vehicles' restriction in part of COOKS ROAD, between its junction with Fleming Road/Otto Street and a point 27 metres south-east of that junction, prohibiting the movement of motor vehicles, which includes certain exceptions and exemptions (listed below);
 - (b) to remove an existing 'permit' parking place 23 metres in length, within CPZ 'J' in COOKS ROAD south-west side (south-east of its junction with Otto Street); and
 - (c) to amend waiting restrictions (i) add an extended length of new 'at any time' waiting restrictions in COOKS ROAD south-west side to accommodate the above-mentioned parking changes, and (ii) convert existing timed waiting restrictions (single yellow lines) to 'at any time' (double yellow lines) in COOKS ROAD south-west side (at its junction with Otto Street) and on the south-east side of both FLEMING ROAD and in OTTO STREET either side of the junction with Cooks Road.

NOTES: (1) These Orders would supersede similar provisions at the above locations implemented by way of experimental Orders made under section 9 of the 1984 Act (which would be revoked). (2) Exemption to the restrictions described in (a) preceding would be provided for emergency services vehicles and for vehicles used for road maintenance, refuse collection or cleansing purposes; exceptions are provided for postal service, taxis and (on a discretionary basis) disabled persons vehicles (registered to Southwark resident 'blue badge' holders), rapid response healthcare workers vehicles and SEND vehicles. (3) All measurements are in metres and are approximate.

The Council of the London Borough of Southwark, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^a, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:

Citation and commencement

- 1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (Cooks Road) Order 202* and shall come into force on ** ***** 202*.

Interpretation

- 2.1 In this Order:-

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"map-based schedule" means the map attached to and to be read in conjunction with this Order and the Order of 2021, which depicts the waiting restrictions imposed by this Order, and, in conjunction with the map schedule legend, identifies the type of each particular waiting restriction, and, if appropriate, certain of its governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map-based schedule and where a waiting restriction is depicted on the map-based schedule, that waiting restriction will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data.

"map schedule legend" means the map schedule legend attached to this Order which, when used in conjunction with the map-based schedule, identifies the specific type of waiting restrictions imposed by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of their governing provisions; and

"the Order of 2021" means the London Borough of Southwark (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Map-based) Order 2021^b.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2021 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Addition to or substitution of items in the map-based schedule

- 3.1 While this Order remains in force, and without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2021 shall have effect as though:-
- (a) where there is no existing item at a location depicted in the map-based schedule attached to that Order, there were added to that map-based schedule the item depicted in the map-based schedule attached to this Order; and
 - (b) where there is an existing item at a location depicted in the map-based schedule attached to that Order, there were substituted in that map-based schedule the item depicted in the map-based schedule attached to this Order.
- 3.2 The substitution referred to in Article 3.1(b) of this Order of any item in in the map-based schedule will have the effect of suspending any provision provided or designated by a previous version of that item in the map-based schedule and not incorporated into the latest version.

Waiting restrictions applicable to restricted streets

- 4.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2021 shall have effect as though any waiting restriction identified in the map-based schedule and by way of the map schedule legend and marked out and signed as a waiting restriction shall be construed as through it were a restricted street referred to in the Order of 2021.

Revocations

- 5.1 While this Order remains in force, and without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (Cooks Road) Experimental Traffic Order 2021^c, is hereby revoked.

This Order, applies the provisions of, and adds or substitutes items in to the map-based schedule attached to the Order of 2021, so as to permanently convert existing timed waiting restrictions in Cooks Road south-west side (at its junction with Otto Street) and on the south-east side of both Otto Street and in Fleming Road either side of the junction with Cooks Road; and an extended length of new 'at any time' waiting restrictions in Cooks Road south-west side (south-east of its junction with Otto Street), in the London Borough of Southwark.

Interpretation

- 2.1 In this Order:-

“Council” means the Council of the London Borough of Southwark;

“enactment” means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

“map-based schedule” means the map attached to and to be read in conjunction with this Order and the Order of 2021, which depicts the parking place designated by this Order, and, in conjunction with the map schedule legend, identifies the type of each particular parking place and, if appropriate, certain of its governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map-based schedule and where a parking place is depicted on the map-based schedule, that parking place will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data.

“map schedule legend” means the map schedule legend attached to this Order which, when used in conjunction with the map-based schedule, identifies the specific type of parking place designated by this Order and, where appropriate, certain of its governing provisions;

“the Order of 2021” means the London Borough of Southwark (Charged-For Parking Places) (Map-based) Order 2021^b; and

“traffic sign” means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under, section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2021 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Amendment of items in the map-based schedule

- 3.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2021 shall have effect as though the existing item indicating the location of a permit-holders only parking place in Cooks Road within CPZ ‘J’ in the map-based schedule attached to that Order were omitted in the map-based schedule attached to this Order.
- 3.2 The amendment referred to in Article 3.1 of this Order of an item in the map-based schedule will have the effect of revoking any provision provided or designated by a previous version of that item in the map-based schedule and not incorporated into the latest version.

Revocations

- 4.1 While this Order remains in force, and without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the London Borough of Southwark (Charged-for parking places) (Cooks Road) Experimental Traffic Order 2021^c, is hereby revoked.

Citation and commencement

- 1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Cooks Road) Traffic Order 202* and shall come into force on ** ***** 202*.

Interpretation

- 2.1 In this Order:-

causing includes permitting;

“disabled person’s badge” and “disabled person’s badge holder” have the same meaning as in Regulation 2 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000^b;

“disabled person’s vehicle” and has the same meaning as in section 142(1) of the Road Traffic “enactment” means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

“kerb-line” means the imaginary line which is the projection of the line formed by the edge of the carriageway of a street;

“motor vehicle” has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

“prescribed street” for the purposes of Article 4.1(f) of this Order means a street or part thereof referred to in Article 3 of this Order;

“taxi” has the meaning given in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^c; and

“traffic sign” means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

Prescribed routes

Cooks Road (at its junction with Fleming Road/Otto Street)

- 3.1 No person shall cause any motor vehicle to proceed in that part of Cooks Road which lies between a point 2 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Otto Street and a point 27 metres south-east of that kerb-line.
- 3.2 Nothing in Article 3.1 above shall apply to a taxi.

Exemptions

- 4.1 Nothing in Article 3 above shall apply in relation to:-
- (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
 - (b) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes;
 - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - (d) any vehicle being used for the purpose of maintenance, improvement, re-construction, cleansing or lighting of that part of street;
 - (e) any vehicle being used in connection with the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to that part of street of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity, or of any electronic communications network; or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, if the vehicle cannot be used for that purpose in any other street or part of street;
 - (f) a refuse collection vehicle being operated by the Council or its appointed contractor, whilst being used for the purpose of refuse collection at premises located within a prescribed street;
 - (g) any vehicle being used for the purposes of the provision of a universal postal service (as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000^d) provided the vehicle bears the livery of a universal postal service provider;
 - (h) a taxi;
 - (i) a disabled person's vehicle, the vehicle registration number thereof being registered with and authorised by the Council for this purpose by or on the behalf of a disabled person's badge holder resident in the London Borough of Southwark, such authorisation being granted by the Council on a discretionary basis and subject to such criteria as may be set from time to time by the Council;
 - (j) a vehicle recognised by the Council as being a "rapid response healthcare workers vehicle", the vehicle registration number thereof being registered with and authorised by the Council for this purpose by or on the behalf of a healthcare worker or healthcare organisation providing healthcare services to residents of the London Borough of Southwark, such authorisation being granted by the Council on a discretionary basis and subject to such criteria as may be set from time to time by the Council; or
 - (k) a vehicle recognised by the Council as being a "SEND vehicle", the vehicle registration number thereof being registered with and authorised by the Council for this purpose by or on the behalf of a person or organisation providing "SEND" services in the London Borough of Southwark, such authorisation being granted by the Council on a discretionary basis and subject to such criteria as may be set from time to time by the Council.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order, on a permanent basis as part of Walworth Streetspace: Cooks Road, introduces a part road closure, enforced by ANPR camera, prohibiting the movement of motor vehicles in Cooks Road (south-east of its junction with Fleming Road/Otto Street), which includes exemptions provided for emergency services vehicles and for vehicles used for road maintenance, refuse collection or cleansing purposes; exceptions provided for postal service, taxis and (on a discretionary basis) disabled persons vehicles (registered to Southwark resident 'blue badge' holders), rapid response healthcare workers vehicles and SEND vehicles, in the London Borough of Southwark.

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
