WESTMINSTER CITY COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Designation of Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Westminster City Council, as the local planning authority, has extended the Westbourne Conservation Area under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The object of such designation is to preserve the character or appearance of areas of special architectural or historic interest, as distinct from individual buildings, to control development in such areas and to stimulate and encourage measures to improve the environment.

Section 277A of the above Act brings demolition of buildings in conservation areas under control by applying with modifications the listed building control provisions of the Act to all buildings in such areas. Anyone wishing to demolish a building in a conservation area must first apply for listed building consent to the Local Planning Authority. Such an application may be made separately or as part of an application for planning permission for the redevelopment of the site, but consent to demolish shall not be taken to have been given as part of planning permission for redevelopment unless specifically stated. In assessing whether or not consent should be granted, planning authorities will take account of the importance of the building to the character or appearance of any part of the Conservation Area.

Section 61A of the Act extends the control over trees in conservation areas by requiring that any person wishing to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in a conservation area subject to certain exemptions shall give the Local Planning Authority 6 weeks notice of his intention of so doing.

The new areas designated are described in the Schedule hereto.
