From all of us at ENGIE, Happy New Year. We hope you enjoyed your Christmas break.

ENGIE is working in partnership with Southwark Council to build new council homes at Meeting House Lane. The project is due to complete in April 2020.

The project involves the demolition of the Acorn Neighbourhood Office at 95a Meeting House Lane and the construction of 29 flats and a community hall. There will be three wheelchair flats and all flats will be for council rent.

What's happened so far?

ENGIE has taken possession of site and is currently erecting hoarding to the perimeter of the site.

What will be happening next?

We are currently finalising erection of the hoarding to the perimeter of the site and preparing for the subsequent demolition works to the building. We will write to you prior to the start of any major works.

New traffic measures are also being implemented.

Protect yourself against bogus callers

To help protect you against bogus callers, ENGIE take a number of precautions including the following;

- Genuine operatives will have an official ENGIE ID badge with a full face photo
- Our operatives wear numbered Hi-Vis jackets
- You can contact your RLO if you doubt the identity of any operative is genuine
- ENGIE do not usually work outside the hours of 8am to 5pm from Monday to Friday or work on weekends. If you see an operative on site outside these hours report it to the Police by calling 101.

If someone can't produce an ID card on request, contact us straight away or call the Police on **101**.
