The scheme makes provision for a basic allowance to be paid to all members, and for special responsibility allowances (SRAs) to be paid to members who take on significant additional responsibilities. The allowances are grouped in bands, and the amounts for each band are set out below. The scheme provides for

The scheme provides that an index-linked increase from 1 April of each year until April 2007, in line with the Local Government Pay Settlement for officers. No member may receive more than one SRA (with the exception of licensing committee members who receive a band 1 allowance in addition to any other band 1 or 2 allowance they already receive. This

Band 3 and 4 allowances are dependant on the number of hours per week the member is employed elsewhere, as set out below:
- less than 11 hours elsewhere, full SRA

- more than 24 hours elsewhere, one third SRA.

ALG Panel's recommendations

The Allowances were set following consideration by the Council's Standards

Committee, and consideration of reports by an Independent Panel constituted by the Association for London Government ("ALG"). The main features of the Independent Panel's 2003 report are that: The amount of Basic Allowance should remain as recommended in the last

and the ranges of allowances within each band, recommended in their previous report, uprated for subsequent increases in the cost of living by reference to an

- report as £8,500, but uprated for subsequent increases in the cost of living by reference to the appropriate index, which in 2003 led to a figure of £9,149.40. Special Responsibility Allowances should continue to be paid in respect of the responsibilities specified in the previous report, and on the basis of the bands
- The index used to uprate allowances should be the Local Government Pay Settlement for Officers, and that this index should apply for the next four years (until April 2007) unless reviewed earlier by the panel. This equates to a figure of £9,963 for 2006/2007. The following figures show the ranges for SRAs (exclusive of the Basic

The Basic Allowance should be treated as covering all intra-Borough travel costs and subsistence, but with local variations.

  Where travel and subsistence allowances are payable, they should be in accordance for the current scheme applicable for the Borough's officers. Travel allowances should extend to travel by bicycles.

  An Annual Allowance for co-optees should be calculated by reference to the estimated number of meetings per year, calculated at £100 per meeting. Co-optees should be reimbursed for all travel costs, whether in or outside the berough but should not be paid subsistence.
- optees should be reimbursed for all travel costs, whether in or outside the borough, but should not be paid subsistence.

  Dependants' carers' allowances should be payable, and a flexible approach is recommended. In particular boroughs should have regard to local social services departments' levels of reimbursement.

  All Members under the age of 70 should in principle be entitled to apply for inclusion in a pension scheme, without satisfying any period of qualification. Both basic and special responsibility allowances should be pensionable.
