Webber Street and Valentine Place

The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No, 37) Order 2017 The London Borough of Southwark (Loading bays) (No. 9) Order 2017 The London Borough of Southwark (Free parking places) (Solo motor cycles) (No, 24) Order 2017 The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'C") (Amendment No, 24) Order 2017

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above orders under the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 2. The effect of the orders would be:-
 - (a) To re-introduce "single yellow line" waiting restrictions in Valentine Place where the solo motor cycle parking spaces have been relocated and a new loading bay has been introduced by the residential and retail development, and amend the "double yellow line" waiting restrictions in Webber Street to accommodate the new loading bay and relocated solo motor cycle parking spaces introduced by the development.
 - (b) To designate a new loading bay in Valentine Place across its junction with Valentine Row to facilitate deliveries to the new development and also revoke a previously unmarked and un-used loading bay in Webber Street and re-provide the loading bay in Webber Street outside the new development.
 - (c) To remove the existing solo motor cycle parking places in Valentine Place and relocate them to Webber Street, so as to accommodate the loading bay for the development.
 - (d) To remove existing permit holders' parking places in Webber Street so as to accommodate the provision of new loading bays and relocated solo motor cycle parking spaces.
