Cycle hangars: provision of secure on-street pedal cycle parking

The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (No. 2) Experimental Traffic Order 2017

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that on 23 February 2017 it has made the above experimental orders under sections 9, 10 and 63 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984¹.
- 2. The effect of the experimental orders will be:-
 - (a) to provide cycle hangars on the carriageway, each having 2.55 metres in length and 2.05 metres in width, and aligned parallel to the kerb, at the following locations:-

AYLESBURY ROAD, the south side, at the flank wall of No. 128 Dawes Street (2 cycle hangars located side by side);

BELLENDEN ROAD, the north-west side, at the boundary of No. 212 Bellenden Road and No. 9 Avondale Rise:

KINCAID ROAD, the east side, at the flank wall of No. 90 Meeting House Lane; and

MERROW STREET, the north-west side, outside Nos. 141-143 Merrow Street.

- (b) to introduce 'at any time' waiting restrictions, 2 metres in length unless otherwise stated, immediately adjacent to the cycle hangar locations detailed above in BELLENDEN ROAD, KINCAID ROAD and MERROW STREET;
- (c) to extend existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions on both sides of the road in AYLESBURY ROAD at its junction with Dawes Street to 7.5 metres, so as to abut the new cycle hangars on the south side of the road; and
- (d) to reduce in length existing 'shared-use' parking places so as to accommodate the provision of the cycle hangers and 'at any time' waiting restrictions detailed above, in AYLESBURY ROAD and MERROW STREET.
- 3. - 5. The council will in due course be considering whether the provisions of the experimental order should be continued in force indefinitely by means of a permanent order made under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Anyone wishing to object to the making of the permanent order or make any other representation regarding the scheme would have 6 months to do so, starting from the date the experimental order comes into force (or, if the order is varied by a subsequent order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, from the date that variation order or modification comes into force), may use the form labelled *'Parking Road traffic and highway schemes responding to statutory consultation notices'* at https://forms.southwark.gov.uk/ or send a statement in writing to: the Traffic orders officer, Highways, Southwark council, Environment, P.O. Box 64529, London SE1P 5LX or by e-mail to traffic.orders@southwark.gov.uk quoting reference H/ND/TMO1617-025. Please note that if you wish to object to the scheme you must state the grounds on which your objection is made.
- 6. When making an objection or representation, please be aware that this may be communicated to other people who may be affected. Information provided in response to this notice, including in some circumstances personal information, may also be subject to publication or disclosure under the requirements of current access to information legislation.
- 7. Anyone wishing to question the validity of the order or of any provision therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting restrictions) (No. 2) Experimental Traffic Order 2017

Introducing cycle hangars forms a part of the Council's objective to significantly increase the number of residents using a bicycle as their preferred mode of transport, particularly for local journeys. This is supported by the Mayor for London's Vision for Cycling.

Cycle hangars are designed to provide a secure on-street cycle parking solution and can only be accessed by a member using a key. They encourage cycling by providing a safe parking place to individuals who would otherwise be put off owning and using a bike in Southwark.

This scheme is being introduced by way of an experiment to allow council officers to monitor demand for the cycle hangars and revise their location if necessary.

The council of the London Borough of Southwark, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 9, 10 and 63 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^a as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:-

Citation, commencement and expiry

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Cycle hangars) (No. 2) Experimental Traffic Order 2017, shall come into force on 06 March 2017, and expires on 22 August 2018.

Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

"carriageway" and "footway" have the same meaning as in section 329(1) of the Highways Act 1980^b:

"civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004°;

"council" means the council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"cycle hangar" refers to an area of carriageway, footway, housing estate land similar to a footway, housing estate road or housing estate car park designated by this Order as a secure parking place for pedal cycles;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"kerb-line" means the imaginary line which is the projection of the line formed by the edge of the carriageway of a street;

"pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^d;

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order:

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Any reference to a named street (or part thereof) shall be construed as a reference to a street which lies within the London Borough of Southwark.

Designation of cycle hangars

- 3.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street or road specified in column (2) of Schedule 1 to this Order, bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, and having a width throughout of 2.05 metres, is designated as a cycle hangar.
- 3.2 Each area on or adjacent to a highway or a housing estate road or a housing estate car park comprising a length of footway or land similar to and adjacent to or contiguous with a footway specified in column (2) of Schedule 2 to this Order, is designated as a cycle hangar.
- 3.3 Each area on a housing estate road or a housing estate car park comprising a length of carriageway of a housing estate road or an area of a housing estate car park specified in column (2) of Schedule 3 to this Order, is designated as a cycle hangar.

Power to suspend the use of a cycle hangar

- 4.1 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Order, the Council or, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, on the occasion of any public procession or for other good and sufficient reason, or a police constable in uniform, or a civil enforcement officer in case of emergency, may suspend the use of any cycle hangar during such period as may be reasonably necessary.
- 4.2 The Council or, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, or a police constable in uniform, or a civil enforcement officer suspending the use of a cycle hangar in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 of this Article, shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that cycle hangar, a traffic sign indicating the use of that cycle hangar is suspended.

Power to modify or suspend this Order

5.1 In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Parking and network management business unit manager (or such other officer of the council as holds the post of Traffic Manager as defined in section 17 of the Traffic Management Act 2004^e) may, if it appears to that officer essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, modify or suspend any provision of this Order, save that no modification shall make an addition.

Suspension or variation of existing parking places

- 3.1 While this Order remains in force and without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order:
 - the designation by the Order of 2007 of the parking places numbered 29 and 102 in (a) Schedule 3 therein is hereby suspended; and
 - the designation by the London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'M2') (No. 1) (b) Experimental Traffic Order 2016^c of the parking place numbered X1 in the Schedule therein is hereby varied to the designation given in the item similarly numbered in the Schedule to this Order.

Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2007 thereto

- Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column (2) of the Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, and having a width throughout of 2 metres, is designated as a parking place.
- The provisions of the Order of 2007 (other than Articles 3 and 10) shall apply to each area 4.2 designated as a parking place by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place shall include a reference to each area designated as a parking place by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 3 to the Order of 2007 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

Placing of traffic signs etc.

- 5.1 The council shall:
 - place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place referred to in the Schedule to this Order:
 - place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in the Schedule to (b) this Order traffic signs indicating that such a parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 4.1 and 4.3 of the Order of 2007; and
 - carry out such other works as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory (c) operation of a parking place.

Power to modify or suspend this Order
