Pedal cycle 'Quietway' route Q14: Borough High Street to Weston Street

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984¹.
- 2. The effect of the orders would be, in:-
 - (a) NEWCOMEN STREET:
 - (i) to restore two-way traffic working throughout;
 - (ii) to close the road to motor vehicles between its junction with Borough High Street and a point 30 metres south-east of that junction, providing a twoway signalized crossing for pedal cycles at its junction with Borough High Street;
 - (iii) to remove the existing disabled persons parking place and permit holders parking place opposite Nos. 67 and 68 Newcomen Street and provide a new loading bay - operating at any time with a 40 minute maximum stay and 2 hours no return period;
 - (iv) to remove the existing permit holders parking place opposite Betsham House and introduce 'at any time' waiting restrictions; and
 - (v) to upgrade single yellow line waiting restrictions to 'at any time' on the south-east side between its junctions with Tennis Street and Bowling Green Place;
 - (b) KIPLING STREET, to upgrade existing single yellow line waiting restrictions to 'at any time' on both sides between its junctions with Snowsfields and Guy Street;
 - (c) GUY STREET, to upgrade all existing single yellow line waiting restrictions to 'at any time' on both sides;
 - (d) WESTON STREET
 - (i) to remove existing permit holders parking places on north-east side opposite its junction with Guy Street and outside Leathermarket Gardens, and introduce 'at any time' waiting restrictions; and
 - (ii) to upgrade single yellow line waiting restrictions to 'at any time' on both sides between its junction with Guy Street and a point 36 metres south-east of that junction.
- 3. Southwark Council hereby GIVES FURTHER NOTICE under sections 90A to 90I of the Highways Act 1980 and in accordance with the provisions of the Highways (Road

humps) Regulations 1999² and the Highways (Traffic calming) Regulations 1999³, propose to construct:-

- (a) speed tables of flat-top construction having a maximum height of 100 millimetres and covering the entire width of the carriageway, at the following locations:-
 - (i) NEWCOMEN STREET, extending from the south-eastern kerb-line of Borough High Street to a point 10 metres south-east of the south-eastern wall of No. 9 Newcomen Street; and
 - (ii) WESTON STREET, extending from a point 6 metres north-west of the northern kerb-line of Guy Street to a point 20 metres south-east of the southern kerb-line of Guy Street, and extending into GUY STREET from the south-western kerb-line of Weston Street westward for a distance of 13 metres (measured on the south side of Guy Street):
- (b) road humps of sinusoidal cross-section construction, 3.7 metres in length, having a maximum height of 100 millimetres and covering the greater width of the carriageway, centred upon the following locations:-
 - (i) NEWCOMEN STREET, at a point 9 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Tennis Street;
 - (ii) NEWCOMEN STREET, at a point 10.5 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Bowling Green Place;
 - (iii) WESTON STREET, at a point 42 metres south-east of the southern kerb-line of Guy Street.

Existing speed cushions at or in the vicinity of these locations would be removed.

- 4. Southwark Council hereby GIVES FURTHER NOTICE that it has approved under section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the provision of an upgraded raised 'zebra' pedestrian crossing at the following location:-
 - WESTON STREET, the centre of which would be located 15.5 metres south-east of the southern kerb-line of Guy Street
 - Zig-zag markings, on which vehicles would be prohibited from stopping at all times would be laid on the north-east side of the road for a distance of 10 metres either side of the crossing, and on the south-west side of the road for a distance of 6.5 metres north-west of and 13 metres south-east of the crossing.

- Jubilee Cycle Grid forms part of Quietway 14 (QW14) that runs between Blackfriars Road and Canada Water
- The route provides a continuous and safe cycle route across inner London. A number of road restrictions: amendments to existing cycle facilities, motor traffic restrictions, and parking places, will be introduced to facilitate the cyclist to travel safely.
- The closure to motor vehicles in Newcomen Street is intended to reduce the volume of non-local through traffic, therefore improving safety and accessibility for pedal cycles in line with the agreed route alignment of Quietway 14.

Citation and commencement

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Pedal cycle quietways) (No. *) Traffic Order 2017, shall come into force on 2017.

Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

causing includes permitting;

"electronic communications network" has the same meaning as that given in section 32 of the Communications Act 2003^b;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^c;

"prescribed street", for the purposes of Article 4.2(b) means any street or part of street referred to in Articles 3.1 to 3.5 of this Order;

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in section 185(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988^d and section 136(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Any reference to a named street (or part thereof) shall be construed as a reference to a street which lies within the London Borough of Southwark.

Prescribed routes

No person shall cause any motor vehicle to enter into or proceed in that length of Newcomen Street which lies between the south-eastern kerb-line of Borough High Street and a point 30 metres south-east of that kerb-line.

Exemptions

- 4.1 Nothing in Article 3.1 preceding shall apply in relation to:
 - anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or (a)
 - any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency; (b)
 - any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or (c) requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
 - any vehicle being used in connection with the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or (d) adjacent to a prescribed street of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity, or of any electronic communications network; or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, if the vehicle cannot be used for that purpose in any other street or part of that street.

Revocation or amendment of existing orders

- 5.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order:
 - the London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (No. 8) Regulations 1952^e shall have effect as (a) though those Regulations were revoked in their entirety; and
 - (b) the London Borough of Southwark Traffic Management (Prescribed Route) (Amendment) Order 2003[†] shall have effect as though Articles 2(A), 2(B) and 2(D) therein were omitted.

Designation of parking place and application of the Order of 2011 thereto

- 4.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in columns (2) and (3) of Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, and having a width throughout of 2 metres, is designated as a parking place.
- 4.2 The provisions of the Order of 2011 (other than Articles 3 and 15) shall apply to each area described in Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a designated parking place or to a parking place shall include a reference to each area designated as a parking place by this Order and as if:-
- (a) any reference to Schedule 1 to the Order of 2011 included a reference to Schedule 1 to this Order.

Placing of traffic signs etc.

- 5.1 The council shall:-
 - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place referred to in Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order;
 - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order traffic signs indicating that such parking places may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Articles 4.1 and 4.2 or 4.4, as the case may be, of the Order of 2011; and
 - (c) carry out such other works as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of the parking places.

- 3.2 The provisions of the Order of 2016 (other than Articles 3.1 and 12.1) shall apply to each area designated as a loading bay by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a loading bay shall include a reference to each area designated as a loading bay by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 1 to the Order of 2016 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.
