Wansey Street parking places

The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'M1') (No. 13) Order 2017
The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No. 41) Order 2017


- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above orders under the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 2. The effect of the orders would be:-
 - (a) Re-distribute the permit holders' parking places and 'shared use' parking places on the south-eastern side of Wansey Street:
 - to provide three permit holders' spaces closer to Garland Court, slightly re-positioned northeastwards to keep the dropped kerb access to the communal refuse bins clear;
 - ii) three 'shared use' parking spaces (3 x 5 metre bays), and
 - iii) 25 metres of permit holder's parking spaces to ensure no net loss of parking spaces in the street.
 - (b) amends the extent of the existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions in Wansey Street to extend them by 4.3 metres across the dropped kerb for the communal refuse bin store of Garland Court in the London Borough of Southwark.

Local parking amendment

A local parking amendment (LPA) is small project to change an existing parking restriction or to introduce a new one. These tend to be carried out in locations where we have had a request to look at dangerous or obstructive parking and where small lengths of restrictions could provide a solution.

Request

Following statutory consultation in April 2017 a number of residents in Wansey Street objected to shared use parking bays being outside their properties and requested this be swapped with resident only parking bays.

Location

Wansey Street is in East Walworth ward and is within the walking distance of Old Kent Road, Bricklayers Arms and all the facility of Elephant and Castle area. The street is within Walworth Controlled Parking zone M1 that operates Mon-Fri 8.30-18.30. Outside of these hours, anyone can park in the area.

Investigation and conclusions

Following statutory consultation, a proposed parking arrangement was rejected by the residents living in Wansey Street. They objected to have shared use parking bays outside their properties.

Recommendation

Based on our investigation and conclusions, the council is recommending, as shown on a drawing below, to install resident parking bays and shared use parking bays as shown.

A detailed design drawing of the proposal is provided within this document.

Next steps

It is expected that statutory consultation will commence in Sep / Oct 2017.

Following the statutory consultation period, the council will make arrangements to install the restrictions (road marking and signage at the location). Should objections be received during the statutory consultation period, these will be presented at the next meeting for determination.
