- Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- The effect of the orders would be, in:-
  - (a) GILKES PLACE to introduce 5.5 metres of 'at any time' waiting restrictions on the south-east side, at its junction with the vehicular access to No.25 Dulwich Village; and
  - (b) GROVE VALE to provide a new inset loading bay, 22 metres in length, on the south-west side outside Nos. 18-22 Grove Vale in which vehicles may load or unload Monday - Saturday between the hours of 7 am and 7 pm (max 40 mins stay, no return within 2 hours).

# Statement of reasons

## **Dulwich Highway Developments – Q1**

### Gilkes Place:

Planning permission was granted on 18 January 2018 to <u>The Dulwich Estate</u> for the development of the ground floor of No. 25 Dulwich Village. The use will be a Class A1 retail unit (the space was formerly a Sui Generis car showroom).

In order for the development to proceed, the applicant has secured the introduction of a length of 'at any time' waiting restrictions immediately south of the vehicle access point in Gilkes Place (at the rear of No. 25 Dulwich Village - an entrance to the servicing yard) to facilitate off-site servicing and deliveries

#### **Grove Vale:**

The proposal relates to the redevelopment of Nos. 18-22 Grove Vale which was given planning permission (16/AP/2978) and includes the provision of a new inset loading bay on Grove Vale which will ensure the highway network is kept free from obstruction during loading/unloading.


The loading bays would be for the commercial (use classes A1/A3), business units (use class B1) and other retail units within the vicinity to ensure access to daily deliveries is provided in safe way. Vehicles may load or unload between these times: Monday – Saturday between the hours of 7 am and 7 pm (max 40 minutes stay, and no return within 2 hours).



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#### Citation and commencement

1.1 This Order may be cited as The London Borough of Southwark (Loading bays) (No. xx) Order 2018 and shall come into force on xx xxxx 2018.

### Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

"council" means the council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment; and

"the Order of 2016" means the London Borough of Southwark (Loading bays) (No. 1) Order 2016<sup>b</sup>.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2016 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

## Designation of loading bays and application of the Order of 2016 thereto

- 3.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, is designated as a loading bay.
- 3.2 The provisions of the Order of 2016 (other than Articles 3.1 and 12.1) shall apply to each area designated as a loading bay by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a loading bay shall include a reference to each area designated as a loading bay by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 1 to the Order of 2016 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

## Placing of traffic signs etc.

- 4.1 The council shall:-
  - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each loading bay referred to in the Schedule to this Order;
  - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each loading bay referred to in the Schedule to this Order, traffic signs indicating that such a loading bay may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles referred to in Article 4.1 of the Order of 2016; and
  - (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a loading bay.
