
# **Public notice**

# **Library Street redevelopments**



The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No. \*) Order 201\*

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above orders under sections 6, 45, 46 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>1</sup>, as amended.
- 2. The effect of the orders would be, in LIBRARY STREET:-
  - (i) to relocate existing pay parking places from the south-west to the north-east side and increase in length by 3.4 metres, so that the pay parking bay is 35.4 metres in length;
  - (ii) on the south-west side, to introduce a new inset loading bay of 18.7 metres in length in which loading would be permitted Monday Saturday (4 hours max stay, no return within 2 hours); and
  - (iii) on both sides, between Borough Road and Davidge Street to convert all existing single yellow line waiting restrictions to double yellow line 'at any time' waiting restrictions and to amend the waiting restrictions to accommodate the above changes.
- 3. Southwark Council hereby GIVES FURTHER NOTICE under sections 90A to 90I of the Highways Act 1980<sup>2</sup> and in accordance with the provisions of the Highways (Road humps) Regulations 1999<sup>3</sup> and the Highways (Traffic calming) Regulations 1999<sup>4</sup>, that will introduce a new speed table of flat-top construction, having a maximum height of 100 millimetres and covering the entire width of the carriageway in MILCOTE STREET: at its north-eastern extremity, from a point 5.2 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line build-out of Library Street north-westward, for all that is public highway. Note: these measures would replace any existing speed tables, speed cushions or road humps at or in the immediate vicinity of the above location.

## Library Street redevelopments

## Library Street - St. George's ward

Planning permission (14/AP/1862) was granted on 11 March 2015 for the redevelopment of 128-150 Blackfriars Road, in the London Borough of Southwark. The premises provide a mixed use scheme comprised of 336 residential units (Class C3), 2,502sqm of office (Class B1), 1,200sqm of retail (Class A1-A4), 528sqm of office or retail (Class B1 or Class A1-A4) and 154sqm of ancillary residential floor space (residents gym), 79 basement car parking spaces together with access, hard and soft landscaping and other associated works incidental to the development.

A new inset loading bay will be introduced on the west-side of Library Street, in which vehicles may load or unload between these times: Monday – Saturday between the hours of 7 am and 7 pm (max 40 minutes stay, and no return within 2 hours).

To accommodate the new inset loading bay, the existing 'pay' parking bays (approx. space for 6 vehicles) require relocation from the western side of Library Street to the eastern side.

Alongside the change to parking bay locations, the existing single yellow lines are to be replaced by double yellow lines restricting waiting 'at any time'.


This arrangement will prevent traffic back-up, providing a smoother route for vehicles to travel along Library Street with reduced risk of vehicle conflict between north and southbound traffic; and with no loss of parking bays.

#### Citation and commencement

### Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

"council" means the council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment; and

"the Order of 2009" means The London Borough of Southwark (Parking Places) (CPZ 'C2') (No. 1) Order 2009<sup>b</sup>.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2009 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

### Revocation

3.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the designation by the Order of 2009 of the parking place numbered 22 in Schedule 3 therein is hereby revoked.

### Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2009 thereto

- 4.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in columns (2) and (3) of a Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, and having a width throughout of 2 metres, is designated as a parking place.
- 4.2 The provisions of the Order of 2009 (other than Articles 3, 15 and 16) shall apply to each area described in the Schedules to this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place shall include a reference to each area designated as a parking place by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 3 to the Order of 2009 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

### Placing of traffic signs, etc.

- 5.1 The council shall:-
  - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place referred to in the Schedule to this Order;
  - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in the Schedule to this Order traffic signs indicating that such a parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 4.1 and 4.3 of the Order of 2007:
  - (c) carry out such other works as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

### Designation of loading bays and application of the Order of 2016 thereto

- 3.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, is designated as a loading bay.
- 3.2 The provisions of the Order of 2016 (other than Articles 3.1 and 12.1) shall apply to each area designated as a loading bay by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a loading bay shall include a reference to each area designated as a loading bay by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 1 to the Order of 2016 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

### Placing of traffic signs etc.

- 4.1 The council shall:-
  - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each loading bay referred to in the Schedule to this Order;
  - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each loading bay referred to in the Schedule to this Order, traffic signs indicating that such a loading bay may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles referred to in Article 4.1 of the Order of 2016; and
  - (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a loading bay.
