The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Troy Town) Traffic Order 201*

The effect of the order would be, to formalise the existing road closure of TROY TOWN to all vehicles except pedal cycles from the part of the carriageway which lies between a point in Nutbrook Street, 2.5 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line buildout of Anstey Road, and its junction with Dewar Street.
 - The road closure will continue to be physically enforced by hard engineering measures.

Statement of reasons

Bellenden Primary School –Troy Town permanent Road Closure

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Troy Town) Traffic Order 201*

Following a trial of both timed and full road closure of Troy Town, in the London Borough of Southwark during the beginning of 2018; it has been recommended to introduce a permanent road closure of Troy Town to all vehicles except pedal-cycles.

The road closure will continue to be physically enforced by hard engineering measures, within the Troy Town area from a point in Nutbrook Street (east of its junction with Anstey Road) to Troy Town's junction with Dewar Street.

Multiple site visits have been carried out prior to and during the timed closure and full closure trial periods.



The council of the London Borough of Southwark, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^a, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (Troy Town) Traffic Order 201*, shall come into force on xx xxxx 201*.

Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

causing includes permitting;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"kerb-line" means the imaginary line which is the projection of the line formed by the edge of the carriageway of a street;

"pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^b;

"prescribed route", for the purposes of Article 4, means any street or part of street referred to in Article 3 of this Order; and

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

Prescribed routes

3.1 No person shall cause any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to enter into or proceed in any part of Troy Town, in the London Borough of Southwark. Which includes all that part of the carriageway as lies between a point in Nutbrook Street, 2.5 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line buildout of Anstey Road, and its junction with Dewar Street.

Exemptions

- 4.1 Nothing in Article 3.1 shall apply in relation to:-
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
 - (b) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency;
 - (c) any vehicle being used in connection with the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to a prescribed street of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity, or of any electronic communications network; or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, if the vehicle cannot be used for that purpose in any other street or part of that street; or
 - (d) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
