Steedman Street - walking and cycling improvements

The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'E') (Amendment No. *) Order 201* The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No. *) Order 201*

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above orders under the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984¹, as amended.
- 2. The effect of the orders would be, in controlled parking zone 'E':
 - in STEEDMAN STREET, (i) to convert the existing lengths of single yellow line waiting restrictions on the north-east and north-west sides to operate 'at any time' (double yellow lines), and (ii) to replace an existing permit holders' parking place on the north-west side, with a new 'shared-use' parking place and increases the length by 3.5 metres (total length of bay 13.5 metres); and
 - in HAMPTON STREET on the north-west side, (i) to revoke a redundant permit holders' parking place; and (ii) to re-define an existing 'shared-use' parking place so as to reflect more closely the location in the street.
- 3. Southwark Council hereby GIVES FURTHER NOTICE under sections 90A to 90I of the Highways Act 1980² and in accordance with the provisions of the Highways (Road humps) Regulations 1999³ and the Highways (Traffic calming) Regulations 1999⁴, propose to:-
 - (a) construct speed tables of flat-top construction having a maximum height of 100 millimetres and covering the entire width of the carriageway, at the following locations:-
 - HAMPTON STREET and WOLLASTON CLOSE junction, extending from a point 21 metres southwest of the western kerb-line of Spare Street south-westward for a distance of 25.5 metres, and (ii) extending from the north-western kerb-line of Hampton Street into WOLLASTON CLOSE northward for a distance of 13.5 metres; and
 - STEEDMAN STREET, extending from the south-eastern kerb-line of Hampton Street south-eastward for a distance of 7 metres; and
 - (b) to place a road hump of sinusoidal cross-section construction approximately 3.7 metres in length, having a maximum height of 100 millimetres and covering the greater width of the carriageway, centred upon the following location: at a point 9 metres south-west of the western kerb-line of Spare Street.

Statement of reasons

Steedman Street - walking and cycling improvements

The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'E') (Amendment No. *) Order 201* The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No. *) Order 201*

The project is part of a wider regeneration programme for the Elephant and Castle area and seeks to improve the public realm in the local area as well as improve the walking and cycling links from Walworth Road to the Newington Estate.

The changes to parking underneath the railway bridge on Steedman Street are made to provide 'shared-use' parking for ticket holders, blue badge holders, and permit holders.

Double yellow lines have been provided to complement widened footways and ensure the safe passage of vehicles on Steedman Street.


The introduction of raised features are for the purposes of slowing vehicle speeds and providing more accessible crossing points for pedestrians.

Citation and commencement

1.1 This Order may be cited as the London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'E') (No. *) Order 201* and shall come into force on xx xxxx 201*.

Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:

"council" means the council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment; and

- "the Order of 2010" means The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'E') (No. 1) Order 2010^b.
- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2014 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Revocation

- 3.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2010 shall have effect as though:-
 - (a) the items numbered 87 and 164 in Schedule 1 therein were revoked; and
 - (b) the item numbered 1 in Schedule 2 therein was revoked.

Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2010 thereto

- 4.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of a Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, is designated as a parking place.
- 4.2 The provisions of the Order of 2010 (other than Articles 3 and 15) shall apply to the areas described in each Schedule to this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a designated parking place or to a parking place shall include a reference to an area designated as a parking place by this Order and as if any reference to Schedule 2 to the Order of 2010 included a reference to the Schedule to this Order.

Placing of traffic signs, etc.

- 5.1 The council shall:-
 - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place referred to in the Schedules to this Order;
 - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in a Schedule to this Order traffic signs indicating that such parking places may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Articles 4.1 and 4.3, as the case may be, of the Order of 2010;
 - (c) carry out such other works as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.
