Pedal cycle contra-flow extension Meymott Street

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (No. *) Traffic Order 201*
The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ'C1') (No. *) Order 201*
The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No. *) Order 201*

- 1. Southwark Council hereby GIVES NOTICE that it proposes to make the above orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984¹.
- 2. The effect of the orders would be, in MEYMOTT STREET:-
 - (a) updates the one-way eastbound traffic working in Meymott Street, so as to provide oneway eastbound traffic working for all vehicles except pedal cycles - by extending the existing contra-flow cycle lane to cover the entirety of Meymott Street (from its junction with Hatfields to its junction Blackfriars Road);
 - (b) reduces in length, by approx. 12.5 metres, the existing permit-holder's parking place bay on the north-west side (new length approx. 20 metres);
 - (c) extends in length, by approx. 8.5 metres, the existing pay parking place bay on the north-west side (new length approx. 25 metres), and removes a redundant pay parking places on the south-east side; and
 - (d) introduce new or amend existing lengths of 'at any time' waiting restrictions so as to accommodate the above-mentioned changes and provision of a new footway and carriageway layout in the quietway route.

Statement of reasons

Pedal cycle contra-flow extension Meymott Street

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed routes) (No. *) Traffic Order 201*
The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ'C1') (No. *) Order 201*
The London Borough of Southwark (Waiting and loading restrictions) (Amendment No. *) Order 201*

The proposals are to update the one-way eastbound traffic working restrictions in Meymott Street, so as to provide one-way eastbound traffic working for all vehicles except pedal cycles by extending the existing contra-flow cycle lane to cover the entirety of Meymott Street. Vehicles except pedal cycles will be prohibited from entering into or proceeding in Meymott Street from Hatfields and into that part of Meymott Street, from Colombo Street, which lies between the eastern kerb-line of Colombo Street and its junction with Blackfriars Road. The changes will be in Meymott Street (within the Borough & Bankside ward), London Borough of Southwark.

Below is a summary of the proposed improvements to Meymott Street:

- Permitting cyclists to travel from Hatfields to Blackfriars Road along the whole of Meymott Street including the section east of Colombo Street.
- Widening of footways, including the removal of three parking spaces, to create a better environment for pedestrians.
- Introduction of raised features on Colombo Street and Hatfields to further slow vehicular traffic and improve pedestrian accessibility.
- Removal of redundant street clutter such as bollards and non-essential signage and the introduction of additional cycle stands.
- The removal of the island at the junction of Meymott Street and Hatfields allowing the proposed footway buildout.
- Reduction in the number of residents' bays from six to four and increase in the number of Pay by Phone bays from three to five.



Interpretation

"council" means the council of the London Borough of Southwark;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment; and

"the Order of 2012" means The London Borough of Southwark (Parking places) (CPZ 'C1') (No. 1) Order 2012^b.

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2012 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Revocation

- 3.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done, or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the designation by the Order of 2012 of:-
 - (a) the parking place numbered 33 in Schedule 1 therein; and
 - (b) the parking places numbered 23 and 24 in Schedule 2 therein, are hereby revoked.

Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2012 thereto

- 4.1 Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, is designated as a parking place.
- 4.2 The provisions of the Order of 2012 (other than Articles 3 and 15) shall apply to the areas described in each Schedule to this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a designated parking place or to a parking place shall include a reference to an area designated as a parking place by this Order and as if:-
 - (a) any reference to Schedule 1 to the Order of 2012 included a reference to Schedule 1 to this Order; and
 - (b) any reference to Schedule 2 to the Order of 2012 included a reference to Schedule 2 to this Order.

Placing of traffic signs, etc.

- 5.1 The council shall:-
 - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place referred to in Schedule 1 or 2 to this Order;
 - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in the Schedule 1 or 2 to this Order traffic signs indicating that such parking places may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Articles 4.1, 4.3 and 4.4, as the case may be, of the Order of 2012;
 - (c) carry out such other works as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

- (a) reduces in length an existing permit-holder's parking place on the north-west side; and
- (b) extends in length an existing pay parking place on the north-west side, and removes another existing pay parking place on the south-east side,

so as to accommodate a new kerb-line build-out in Meymott Street, in the London Borough of Southwark.

Interpretation

2.1 In this Order:-

causing includes permitting;

"electronic communications network" has the same meaning as that given in section 32 of the Communications Act 2003^b;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

"pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^c;

"prescribed street", for the purposes of Article 4.2(b) means any street or part of street referred to in Articles 3.1 to 3.5 of this Order;

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in section 185(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988^d and section 136(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

- 2.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- 2.3 Any reference to a named street (or part thereof) shall be construed as a reference to a street which lies within the London Borough of Southwark.

Prescribed routes

- 3.1 No person shall cause any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to proceed in Meymott Street in a direction other than from east to west.
- 3.2 No person causing any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to proceed in Hatfields shall, upon reaching its junction with Meymott Street, cause that vehicle to enter into Meymott Street.
- 3.3 No person causing any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to proceed in Colombo Street shall, upon reaching its junction with Meymott Street, cause that vehicle to enter into that part of Meymott Street which lies between the eastern kerb-line of Colombo Street and its junction with Blackfriars Road.

Exemptions

- 4.1 Nothing in Articles 3.1 to 3.3 preceding shall apply in relation to:-
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
 - (b) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency;
 or
 - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 4.2 Nothing in Article 3.1 above shall apply in relation to any vehicle being used in connection with the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in or adjacent to a prescribed street of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity, or of any electronic communications network (as defined in section 32 of the Communications Act 2003b); or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, if the vehicle cannot be used for that purpose in any other street.

Revocation

5.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Southwark (Prescribed Routes) (No. 3) Traffic Order 1985^e is hereby revoked.

This Order:-

- (i) updates the one-way eastbound traffic working restrictions in Meymott Street, so as to provide one-way eastbound traffic working for all vehicles except pedal cycles by extending the existing contra-flow cycle lane to cover the entirety of Meymott Street;
- (ii) prohibits vehicles except pedal cycles from entering into or proceeding in Meymott Street from Hatfields; and
- (iii) prohibits vehicles except pedal cycles from entering into or proceeding into that part of Meymott Street, from Colombo Street, which lies between the eastern kerb-line of Colombo Street and its junction with Blackfriars Road,
