## **Get involved**

#### What are the facts?

We have gathered data on air quality hotspots, traffic volume, through traffic routes, traffic speeds and collision hotspots. Our online map shows the issues for the area, at specific hotspots, and a summary of what you told us from the various engagement.

#### What have you told us?

Recent projects and engagement with residents in Dulwich (see panel) have shown a common theme that there is too much traffic in the area, and this is having an adverse effect on local life. We want to work with residents to address these concerns about traffic volume and its impact on the community.

#### What kind of solutions do you want?

The council would like to work with residents to explore ways to tackle the issues, encourage more active travel such as walking and cycling, especially for the thousands of pupils travelling in this area as part of their route to school, and improve air quality and road safety conditions in your area.

#### How did we get here?

Problem 1: Peckham Rye to Dulwich Qvietway



Engagement feedback with the local community highlighted concerns about the safety and volume of traffic at Barry Road/Lordship Lane/Eynella Road junction, affecting air quality and safety for pedestrians and cyclists using the junction.

#### Problem 2: Dulwich Traffic Management Study 2017-18



Engagement feedback with the local community highlighted concerns about the volume of through traffic in the area resulting in air quality and road safety issues.

#### Problem 3: Dulwich Village / Calton Avenue / Court Lane Junction Monitoring (2018)



Feedback from residents and the monitoring survey shows that volume of traffic going through the junction affects its safe operation. Traffic volume through the junction needs to be addressed to improve safety conditions for pedestrians and cyclists using the junction.
